PASTORAL SERVICES

U.S. Bishop Chairmen for Pro-Life and Doctrine Committees' statement regarding ethical concerns surrounding the new coronavirus vaccines. They say: "In view of the gravity of the current pandemic...the reasons to accept the new COVID-19 vaccines from Pfizer and Moderna are [sufficient] to justify their use...in addition, receiving the COVID-19 vaccine ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good.
