BARBARA HESENIUS

Barbara came to SJR in July of 2000, having served St. Mary's, Corning for several years previous, and earlier in the Mid-West. It is well-known to us that she hails from Boston.

Barb is blest with deep faith and lively relationship with Jesus. She has led a Monday Bible Study for several years which attracts 25+ devoted attendees each week. Her knowledge of Scripture is fed by a deep prayer life, formed over many years. Before going into Parish Ministry, she spent several years with a lay Christian community that did retreat work, and individual spiritual direction. She brought that life of prayer and devotion to us in both her style, and depth of service to our parish. We heard it as she reflected on God's word, were inspired when she wrote in the bulletin, and formed as she led Stephen Ministry for these twenty years. Barb not only led our parish Stephen Ministry, she coordinated a bi-yearly training of new Stephen Ministers with the other Fairport churches. Her devotion to, and conviction of, the importance of this lay ministry has sustained it here at SJR and beyond.

Every Thursday she set out across the city to go to the bedside of our parishioners in hospitals. Barb recruited, trained, and coordinated parish members who also went each weekday to hospitals visiting our parishioners, and others visiting parishioners at home. I cannot begin to count the times I have been thanked, our parish acknowledged, for this attentive care.

If you called for a Baptism, or to schedule a wedding, Barb worked with you. She coordinated the teams who prepared parents of newborn children, and our Pre Cana teams working with our couples for marriage. In each case, both the ministry, and the information being delivered, was first rate. Over these twenty years, Barb

has worked with each of the couples preparing for marriage. She met five or more times reviewing vital information about married life, and the values that we as Catholics have and hold about the Sacrament of Matrimony.

In large measure, Barb's ministry among us was one of empowerment. She believes in the in-dwelling presence of Jesus, and the power and Grace of the Holy Spirit in each person. She sees her call as one who enables us to do what God has already empowered us to do. So many have been raised up by her ministry in our midst and found paths of service throughout the parish. I will miss her clear vision, and you will miss her well edited documents I send out. We will miss her faithful presence at mass, at our bedside in the hospital, in our study of scripture, and so much more.

She is excited about retirement and hopes to be able to travel. As with so many things now, much is on hold as we make our way through this Corona time. She has bought a new home north of Boston near Worcester where she will be close to her two sisters, family, several lifelong friends, and all Boston Sports. All that, and heaven, too.





PERINTON FOOD SHELF


The Perinton Food Shelf is currently filled to capacity with everyone's generous donations and have run out of storage room.

 - o Kindergarten prep will be sent home monthly for this option only



Wash Your Hands


Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds using soap and water. If you can't wash your hands, use hand sanitizer frequently.
